What were your top two successes?

We decided to formulate new goals in February.

- A short term goal was to pilot a new registration method for incoming first-year students. Students would be asked to login and register for typical, Gen Ed classes that don't have prerequisites. Discussions began with the Honors college and Engineering college to see if they would be interested. Updates on this will come at our April meeting.
- 2. A long term goal was to meet with representatives from advising, financial aid and admissions to get an understanding of if and how layoffs of 2015 have continued to impact their ability to serve students. It was noted in the HLC student survey that students often felt underserved in these areas. The March meeting agenda included two out of three of these representatives, but was cancelled at the last minute due to illness and scheduling conflicts.

What were your top two challenges?

1.*In November, President Wilson convened a special committee to review and revamp the undergraduate scholarship process at UA. Given that the revamp was substantial and rapid, the UC SES committee decided to suspend the goals until we knew what the new system would be and how any of these concerns may be affected.
